Mission to the World: Japan (Tokyo)

Japan is a rugged, mountainous island nation about the size of California with a population about half that of the United States and a density of 825 people per square mile, one of the highest in the world. Japan is known to be one of the wealthiest nations in the world, and most Japanese enjoy a standard of living much the same as people in North America. In a spiritual sense, Japan is a very needy nation. Of the country's 125 million people, less than one percent is Christian. Of these approximately one million Christians, 60% belong to a Protestant denomination while 40% are Roman Catholic. Freedom of religion is allowed in the Japanese constitution, and the entire nation can be reached by one language, but a combination of traditional and modern cultural factors presents a tremendous barrier to the gospel. Most Japanese follow ancient sects of Buddhism and Shintoism, or more recently, materialism.

Current Ministries: We are investing our resources of personnel, finances, and prayer toward a church-multiplication movement among the Japanese. This work includes: evangelism, teaching English as a second language, discipleship, direct church planting, university ministry, training pastoral interns for future ministry, serving on the PCJ's foreign missions committee, helping start and providing ongoing leadership for a nationwide, bilingual, gospel-driven church-planting institute, operating a 1st-12th grade school for missionary kids, and since 2006, working together with our Japanese brothers and sisters in starting a school for Japanese covenant children as well.

*Confession of Faith

We believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible, and in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, begotten from the Father before all ages, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten not made, of the same essence as the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven; he became incarnate by the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and was made human. He was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried. The third day he rose again according to the Scriptures. He ascended to heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again with glory to judge the living and the dead. His kingdom will never end. And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life. He proceeds from the Father and the Son, and with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified. He spoke through the prophets. We believe in the one holy catholic and apostolic church. The Eucharistic Sacrament of the Lord's Supper:

Eucharist means "the good grace" and "communion" implies a real participation in that grace. Therefore, the

Lord's Supper is both a thankful memorial service to remember Christ's sacrificial death on the cross and a life giving participation in that grace as we are being united to Christ in heaven by the Holy Spirit and received by faith. In short, Christ is really present in, with and through the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, even if not bodily but spiritually being united to the body of Christ in the church.

Then I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels surrounding the throne and the living creatures and the elders; they numbered myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, singing with full voice, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slaughtered to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!"
