Mission to the World: Slovak Republic

Slovakia was a communist country until 1989. Someone said, "You can cut down the tree, but the roots are still there." Getting at the "roots" of this country is a challenge. Trnava itself holds "a culture within a culture." Popularly known as "The Vatican" or "The Rome of Slovakia," Trnava is the seat of the Archbishop of Slovakia and was the launching point of the counter-reformation. Predictably, most citizens consider themselves Catholic and, therefore, Christians. Sadly, the average person considers us to be a "cult." This requires sensitive, persistently loving living before a watching city. The country itself is absolutely beautiful with nature abounding that is the envy of its neighbors. Slovakia is located 1 hr. from Vienna, 4 hrs. from Prague and Krakow and 2 hrs. from Budapest and 8 hrs. from Venice, Italy.

Current Ministries:

Nearly every evening The Building is open to the public so university and high school students can come to hang out. To the general public, The Building offers evening conversational English classes. We also have clubs for guys and girls which meet weekly. Each summer we hold three or four camps which are very popular with which God has greatly used either to bring people to a saving faith or to sow seeds to that end. Our church plant continues to offer MTW personnel opportunities through its weekly Bible study, several studies for men and women, and a developing work focused on Roma ("Gypsy") children.

A Man's Relation to the Home:

Part 2: Bible and Gender on the Occasion of Father's Day

[Sermon notes located on page 16]

[25] *Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, [26] that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, [27] so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. [28] In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. [29] For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body. [31] "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." [32] This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church. [33] However, let each one of you love his wife as himself, and let the wife see that she respects her husband.*

It is as if we join the holy procession of saints throughout history in offering ourselves as a living and holy sacrifice made acceptable to God by Christ who completes us by faith. Please give as an act of worship and only if you can give cheerfully as unto the Lord.

The Eucharistic Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper:

Eucharist means “the good grace” and “communion” implies a real participation in that grace. Therefore, the Lord’s Supper is both a thankful memorial service to remember Christ’s sacrificial death on the cross and a life giving participation in that grace as we are being united to Christ in heaven by the Holy Spirit and received by faith. In short, Christ is really present in, with and through the sacrament of the Lord’s Supper, even if not bodily but spiritually being united to the body of Christ in the church.

I therefore ask that You would enable me to turn away from trusting in my own efforts to gain Your acceptance and forgiveness, and trust in the perfectly righteous efforts of Christ on my behalf in order to be accepted by You and entered into Your holy family. And just as You raised Christ from the dead, so too I ask that You would give me a new life in Christ, one that will lead eventually to Heaven itself. Thank you for Christ, and the power of the Holy Spirit to believe in Him alone for my salvation.
